Happy Sunday, Team Grace!

As we journey through Ordinary Time, we walk through Saint Matthew's Gospel. Of the four gospel books, Saint Matthew most emphasizes the Lord Jesus' role as Teacher and Law-Giver. Today, in our Gospel Reading, we hear another parable from the Lord.

Today's parable is a pressing one. We are told of the king who invites a second round of guests for a banquet. When a guest shows up and refuses to wear the proper garments, which were usually provided by the host, he is thrown out and punished. The Lord concludes by reminding us: "Many are invited, but few are chosen."

In our faith, simply because we have been invited, does not mean that we will be chosen. We must enter the banquet of the Lord and "put on" his way of life. We must seek to wear the garment given to us by God's grace. Only in this way, will the invited become the chosen. How are we living? Are we wearing the garment of the Lord?

As a parish family, we continue to review contemporary social issues. So far, we've covered *Human Dignity and Life Issues, Immigration and the Common Good,* and the *LGBTQ Movement and Complementarity*. This Sunday, I'm going to cover *The Environment and Stewardship*.

Some things happening around the parish:
