This Tuesday, December 8, is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. Masses at the parish will be celebrated on December 7 at 4:00 PM and 5:30 PM, and on December 8 at 9:00 AM, 11:00 AM, and 7:00 PM. The 11:00 AM and 7:00 PM Masses will be livestreamed.

The Mass will conclude with a bagpipe and candlelit procession from the church to the statue of Our Lady at the entrance of our campus. Please also note that ten minutes before every Immaculate Conception Mass, all parishioners will be invited to make (or renew) their Consecration to Jesus through Mary. Please be early to Mass if you want to make this consecration.

Please further note that Confessions will be available after all the Immaculate Conception Masses (except the 7 PM).
