From Father Kirby...

Happy Sunday, Team Grace! As we make our journey through Ordinary Time, Saint Mark tells us about the Lord's battle with dark forces. Today, he exorcizes a demon and shows the power of his authority. In our lives, are we allowing the Lord to expel bad spirits and sins? Do we seek and rely upon his authority?

Today, we continue our five-week homily series on the biblical notion of mercy and of our call to be a People of Mercy.

As a quick update, Team Grace, I'm happy to announce that our Capital Campaign currently stands at \$760,000! Thanks be to God! You might recall that we need \$850,000 to purchase Catholic Land (the 53 acres down Highway 521). We are very close, Team Grace! Thank you for the generosity of so many! Once we purchase the land, the seller will turn around and give the parish a \$100,000 gift. With this gift, we can initiate the Master Plan of Catholic Land and break ground for our new prayer garden and columbarium!

After this feast day, the statue of the Christ Child is removed from in front of the ambo and all our Christmas flowers are taken away.

Our weekly Bible Study continues this Wednesday. This week we'll continue our talk on the Call of Abraham in Genesis 12. As a reminder all previous lessons can be found on our <u>Grace Lily</u> page.

This coming Saturday, February 6, is First Saturday. Confessions will be at 10:30 AM. Our monthly Healing Mass will be at 11:00 AM. The Anointing of the Sick will be offered.
