Happy Sunday, Team Grace! Today, we continue to move through Saint Mark's Gospel. The Evangelist describes the Lord Jesus as the Healer and Consoler of those who are ill and suffering. In the sequence from last week to this week, we see that the Lord not only destroys evil, but he also builds up what is right and good. In our lives, do we seek to be a healer and consoler to those around us?

Today, we continue our five-week homily series on the biblical notion of mercy. This Sunday, the figure of Saint Joseph will be introduced as an example of a just and compassionate person. This introduction to Saint Joseph is to help get us ready for our preparation for a Consecration to Saint Joseph, in honor of this Year of Saint Joseph declared by Pope Francis.

Please note that next weekend, we'll be distributing the books for the Consecration to Saint Joseph after all the parish Masses. The preparation begins on February 15 (with the Consecration occurring on March 19).

Some things happening around the parish:

As I mentioned last week at all the Masses, our sound system recently crashed. We've sent our sound panel to be repaired. We're hoping it will return within the next week or two. In the interim, we're using an auxiliary system and strategically placed speakers through the worship space. We know it's not perfect. Please be patient.
