Also this weekend, after all the Masses, copies of my new book, <u>Manual for</u> <u>Suffering</u>, will be available for purchase. The manual presents the depth and beauty of the Church's theology of redemptive suffering.

This Monday, November 22, I'll be away for meetings in Charleston. There will be no Confessions during the day and no public Mass. All devotions will still be celebrated, including our evening <u>Holy Hour</u> (which will have Confessions available).

Our parish Bible Study, High School Formation Program, and Middle School Formation Program are all on pause this Wednesday, November 24. We'll see everyone next Wednesday, December 1.

In honor of Thanksgiving, the church building and Parish Office will close at 1:00 PM this Wednesday, November 24. The Parish Office will be closed on Thursday, November 25. Our parish Thanksgiving Mass will be celebrated at 11:00 AM on Thursday. All are welcome!

Next Sunday, we start the Advent season. At our 11:00 AM Mass, we'll have a children's homily and the blessing of the parish Baby Jesus. Small Baby Jesus figurines will be given to the children.

Next Sunday, around 12:15 PM, we'll have our annual Gingerbread Day in the Parish Hall. All children are welcome! Each child will receive their own free gingerbread house to decorate!

Please note that preparation for <u>Consecration to Jesus through Mary</u> formally started on November 5. There will be opportunities to make (or renew) your consecration on December 8, the feast of the Immaculate Conception.
