Happy Sunday, Team Grace!

Today, we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord. The word “epiphany” is Greek for “manifestation.” The word is used for today’s feast day since the long-awaited Anointed Savior is revealed not simply to the Chosen People of old, but to all nations and peoples of the world.

The Magi are led from the East to pay homage to the Newborn King. He is their king, he is the King of Israel, he is the king of all nations, he is our king. In your life, what gifts do you bring to our king on this Epiphany?

For today’s feast day, sheets that contain the annual Epiphany blessing of homes are located in the narthex. All households are encouraged to do this important blessing in their homes.

For those who are doing the Five First Saturdays, the change of dates is still within the eight-day time span permitted by the Church. The consecutive nature of the devotion is not broken by this change.

In addition, with me being away, we will not have Confessions or public Masses on Monday- Tuesday, January 3-4. *All our devotions, the Rosary, and our Adoration time will still take place.*
