Here are some things happening at the parish this week:

This Sunday, April 2, we have our Solemn Procession of Palms at the beginning of our 11:00 AM Mass. All parishioners are asked to arrive around 10:45 AM and to meet at the statue of Our Lady at the entrance of the parish campus.

Our annual Spring Festival will be after the 11:00 AM Mass on Sunday. For the festival, we'll have some BBQ, a petting zoo, pony rides, and a lot of other activities. All are welcome!

Please note we will not have Confessions or daily Mass this coming Monday and Tuesday, April 3-4. I'll be in Charleston for the annual Chrism Mass with the Bishop. The campus and parish office will be opened on Monday (April 3), but will be closed on Tuesday (April 4).

Our Faith Formation on Wednesday evenings is on hiatus until April 19.

Our Holy Week schedule (from Wednesday to Sunday) is as follows:

Spy Wednesday (April 5): Confessions 10:00 AM – 11:30 AM; Rosary at 11:30 AM; Mass at Noon; Saint Dymphna Novena at 12:30; Confessions from 12:45 PM until last penitent. Adoration from 12:45 PM – 2:15 PM.

Holy Thursday (April 6): No day events. Parish Office and campus are closed during the morning and afternoon. No 12 Noon Mass. Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7:00 PM. Confessions from 8:30 PM – 11:30 PM. Adoration (Altar of Repose) from 8:30 PM – Midnight.

Good Friday (April 7): Parish Office closed. Confessions from 9:00 AM - 2:30 PM; Solemn Stations of the Cross at 12 Noon; Liturgy of the Lord's Passion at 3:00 PM; Confessions from 4:30 PM - 8:00 PM.

Holy Saturday (April 8): Parish Office and campus closed in the morning and afternoon. No 4:00 PM or 5:30 PM Masses. Great Easter Vigil at 8:30 PM.

Easter Sunday (April 9): Mass at 9:00 AM and 11:00 AM.

Please note that the Parish Office and campus are closed for Easter Week, April 10 – 14. There is no public Mass. All activities are suspended.
