Happy Sunday, Team Grace! This weekend, we move back to Ordinary Time. The liturgical season is all about discipleship. Mother Church takes us back to the classroom and teaches us again what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. During this Ordinary Time, I invite you to recommit yourself to the Lord. I encourage you to once again declare in your heart, "Jesus Christ is Lord!"

This weekend, the parish is hosting a Diaper Drive. All parishioners are asked to bring children's diapers to Mass with them. Parishioners can drop off the diapers before Mass at the pavilion. Members of our Helping Hands ministry will be on site to assist you.

This Sunday, we'll once again host two blood buses on our campus. There is a dire need for blood in our area and so I encourage all parishioners to consider giving blood. It's not too late! Here's the link to sign up.

This weekend, our nation pauses to remember Dr Martin Luther King and all those involved in the Civil Rights Movement. In observance of the national holiday, our church and parish campus will be closed on Monday, January 15. There is no public Mass, and all events are suspended at the parish. *May God bless our nation with greater racial harmony and a deeper love between neighbors!*

Some things happening at the parish that I'd like to highlight this week:

With the end of the Christmas season, the Nativity scene and other expressions of Christmas have been taken down. The Christ Child and the poinsettias, however, will remain near the ambo and altar until the Feast of the Presentation on February 2. This is done as a devotional practice as we anticipate the Lord's Presentation.

It's great to see the work continue on our Holy Angels Columbarium and on the Front Hill! Please pray for our contractors and the various workers involved in the project. The anticipated conclusion of the work is still sometime in March.

The annual Priest Convocation will be held this week, Monday – Thursday, January 15-18. All priests of the diocese will be with the Bishop. As such, there are no Confessions or public Masses at the parish on these days. The Rosary, our regular Adoration times, and our daily devotions will all be offered Tuesday – Thursday.

Please note, however, the change of times on <u>our parish calendar</u>. Come and join your parish for public prayer!

As an update, my mother's knee surgery has been rescheduled to January 16. As Providence would have it, the surgery falls during the Priest Convocation. The Bishop and I were able to talk, and he has dispensed me from the convocation this year. He is allowing me to be with my mom and siblings for the surgery and post-surgery recovery. And so, I'll be in Charlotte for the surgery and then Columbia for my mom's post-surgical recovery. I'm grateful to the Bishop for his kindness. I ask for your prayers for my mom's recovery. As I mentioned before, this will be the *fifth* surgery on the same knee! Your prayers are needed and greatly appreciated.
