Some things happening at the parish that I'd like to highlight this week:

will begin with the blessing of our parish candles in the narthex of the church. Parishioners are invited to bring any candles that will be used for sacred purposes for the blessing.

The Blessing of Throats in honor of Saint Blaise will be offered at the end of our First Saturday Healing Mass this Saturday, February 3, at 11:00 AM. With the cold and flu season upon us, everyone is invited to come and receive the saint's blessing for continued health.

Some other future events I'd like to highlight:

On Friday evening, February 9, at 7:00 PM, the parish is happy to host the young theologian, Clement Harrold. Clement will talk about Lent and Mary Magdalene. The talk will be a great opportunity to prepare for a fruitful Lent! A fellowship will follow the talk. All are welcome!

Our monthly Stations of the Cross for those who have left the Faith will be on Monday, February 12, at 7:00 PM.

The sacred season of Lent begins on February 14 this year. Our Masses for Ash Wednesday are 7:00 AM, 9:00 AM, and 11:00 AM. Other than for our homebound parishioners and those in care facilities, *ashes will only be distributed during Masses*. Confessions will be available after each Mass. Adoration will be held from 12 Noon until 4:00 PM.

For Lent this year, we'll have weekly Stations of the Cross on Wednesdays at 5:30 PM starting February 21.

Some general announcements for the good of the parish:

As we begin to prepare for our parish's participation in our Diocesan Eucharistic Congress, please note the following:

- Our Saturday evening Masses on Saturday, April 6, are suspended. We will not have Masses on Saturday evening, April 6, since the parish will be in Columbia for the Eucharistic Congress.
- Registrations will begin next week for parishioners and families.
