From Father Kirby...

Happy Sunday, Team Grace! We are now in the holy season of Lent. This is a time for serious penance, as we seek to die to ourselves and live for the Lord Jesus. What is distracting you from the Lord? What is taking you away from a full adherence to the Gospel?

This weekend, our nation pauses to honor the early presidents of our country. We ask God to continue to pour out his blessings upon the United States of America.

The parish campus will be closed on Monday, February 19, in honor of Presidents' Day. There is no public Mass that day. All other activities are suspended. May God continue to bless the United States of America!

It's my great hope that many of you will choose to participate in our Diocesan Eucharistic Congress on Saturday, April 6. The parish is sponsoring buses for the event and will provide free polo shirts. Here's the registration form. Some things happening at the parish that I'd like to highlight this week:

During Lent, please note that the Church takes on certain penitential practices: the color violet is used; the "Gloria" at the beginning of Mass is paused; the "Alleluia" is suspended throughout the Mass; flowers and festive music are halted; and, here at our parish, we reduce our altar candles from six to two. All of these are external reminders to us of the penitential nature of Lent.

When our parish opened the doors of our church building over seven years ago, I agreed to two evening Masses on Saturday evening. We've held that schedule since then. Time, however, has proven that two Masses are not needed. As such, starting Saturday, April 13, we're going to merge the two Masses into one Mass at 5:00 PM. This arrangement meets both Mass groups in the middle and provides the option of a Saturday evening Mass, even though this is not preferred by the Church.

Starting on Saturday, April 13, we'll have Solemn Vespers at 4:00 PM on Saturdays. This is the preferred way to begin the Lord's Day. Everyone is encouraged to come and join in the Evening Prayer of the Church!

Confessions will still be heard from 3:00 - 3:30 PM on Saturdays.

This Tuesday - Wednesday, February 20-21, I'll be away giving a Parish Mission at Saint Columba's Parish in Dothan, Alabama. While I'm away, Father Morey will offer daily Mass and hear Confessions.

This Wednesday, February 21, at 5:30 PM, our weekly Stations of the Cross for Lent begin. All are welcome!

Deacon Tom Heath recently celebrated his first anniversary as a Deacon, and so for our adult Bible Study this Wednesday, February 21, at 6:30 PM, the Deacon will talk about the diaconate and his experiences as a deacon this past year. All are encouraged to come and hear the Deacon's testimony!

This Thursday, February 22, <u>Deacon Harold Burke-Sivers</u> will be visiting our parish. The Deacon will give a talk on *Building a Civilization of Love: A Catholic Response to Racism*. A sacred music concert will be offered at 6:30 PM. The Deacon will speak at 7:00 PM. A fellowship and book-signing will be held after the talk. Free copies of the Deacon's recent book will be distributed to those who attend the event. All are welcome!

Our next Prayer Outreach at the local abortion facility is next Saturday, February 24, at 8:30 AM. All parishioners are encouraged to come and join in this peaceful, prayerful protest against abortion. The facility is located at 3220 Latrobe Drive, Charlotte, NC.

Some other future events I'd like to highlight:

On Thursday, March 7, at 7:00 PM, author and social commentator <u>Noelle Mering</u> will give a talk on her book, *Awake, Not Woke!* All are welcome to come to the talk! A fellowship and book-signing will be held afterwards. Free copies of Noelle's book will be given to those who participate.

The pilgrimage is a personal pilgrimage of mine and many people from different parts of the United States will be participating in it. *All are welcome!*
