- In observance of Passiontide, Mother Church suggests that we veil our statues and holy images, and that the bells which are symbols of joy be suspended.

- There are no flowers in the sanctuary due to the penitential nature of Lent.

- The US Bishops recently revised several aspects of the RCIA, which is the process by which a person prepares for baptism or full entrance into the Church. These changes included a name change. The process is now called the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA). You will now hear us refer to the OCIA program.
- My apologies to any household that received their March Liturgy of the Hours late. Word on Fire, who supplies the Liturgy of the Hours for us, had some administrative problems, but we're told it has all been worked out. Everyone should receive their April book on time.
- Next Sunday, March 24, our 11:00 AM Mass will begin with the Solemn Procession of Palms.
