If you are driving yourself, still meet at the parish campus at 7:00 AM to get your ticket and a blessing. Some things happening at the parish that I'd like to highlight this week:

As is our custom here at the parish, the campus and church are closed the week after Easter. As such, we will be closed this coming Monday – Thursday, April 1-4. There is no public Mass. All events are suspended.

This coming Friday, April 5, we have our modified Nocturnal Adoration for First Friday. Please come and join your parish family for Mass at 7:00 PM, followed by Adoration and Confessions until Midnight.

Due to the diocesan Eucharistic Congress, please note that there are no First Saturday observances next Saturday, April 6. There are also no 4:00 PM and 5:30 PM evening Masses next Saturday, April 6.

Next Sunday, April 7, we'll have our annual Divine Mercy Service from 3:00 PM – 4:30 PM. We'll have Eucharistic Adoration, Confessions, the singing of the Divine Mercy Chaplet, readings from Saint Faustina's *Diary*, and other devotions. All are welcome!

Our Wednesday faith formation programs are still on Spring hiatus until Wednesday, April 10.

Some other future events I'd like to highlight:

As a Papal Missionary of Mercy, I'm sometimes asked to assist as a confessor/spiritual director for priest retreats. On Monday – Thursday, April 8-11, I'll be serving in this capacity at a national priest retreat in Austin, Texas. Please remember the priest retreatants in your prayers!

On Monday evening, April 8, *our 5:30 PM Mass is cancelled*. We'll still have the rosary at 5:00 PM. The Miraculous Medal Novena will be prayed at 5:30 PM and our evening Adoration time will follow afterwards until 6:55 PM. At 6:55 PM, one of our parish deacons will give Benediction.

On Tuesday – Thursday, April 9-11, Father Bob Morey will be here at the parish. He'll offer the daily Masses and hear daily Confessions. Our parish schedule remains the same for devotions and other events.

On Wednesday evening, April 10, during our regular adult formation time, 6:30 – 7:45 PM, Dr. John Acquaviva will give a guest presentation on themes relating to sports.

Please note there are no Confessions on Wednesday evening, April 10.

As a reminder, starting Saturday, April 13, we're only going to have a 5:00 PM Saturday evening Mass.

Starting on Saturday, April 13, we'll have Solemn Vespers at 4:00 PM on Saturdays. Everyone is encouraged to come and join in the Evening Prayer of the Church!
