Please join us every Saturday evening at 4:00 PM for Solemn Vespers. All are welcome to come and welcome the Lord's Day in prayer! On Saturday, June 8, the visiting Dominican Sisters will pray Vespers with us! After Vespers, we'll have a fellowship with the Sisters. *All are welcome!*

Some other future events I'd like to highlight:

This coming June 9-20, I'll be away on pilgrimage visiting the holy places of France. I'll carry each of you with me throughout the pilgrimage. Next weekend in the narthex, I'll have sheets out for any parishioner to write their intentions.
