Some things happening at the parish that I'd like to highlight this week:

As previously announced, we now *only have a 5:00 PM* Anticipated Sunday Mass on Saturday evenings.

Next Sunday, May 19, is Pentecost. Please remember to wear red for Mass that weekend. This older custom is a reminder to us that the Holy Spirit dwells within us.

Some other future events I'd like to highlight:

The work on our new parish website continues. It will still be a couple of months before we'll be able to launch it, but I wanted to make the parish family aware that it is still under development.
