Happy Trinity Sunday, Team Grace! With the conclusion of the Easter Season and as we prepare to begin Ordinary Time, Mother Church gives us the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Today, we celebrate the inner life of God! We rejoice in the revelation of this great mystery and aspire every day to accept the invitation to be a part of this Divine Family.

This Sunday, May 26, we have our monthly Fellowship Sunday at 12:15 PM in the Parish Hall. Come and join us for fellowship and a donut!

Since the First Friday and First Saturday are split this month, we'll have our First Saturday observances on June 8. Sign-ups for Nocturnal Adoration will be next weekend.

This Monday, May 27, is Memorial Day. We pray for our nation and for the repose of all those who have died in defense of our freedoms. The parish will have a Memorial Day Mass at 11:00 AM. The Mass will be followed by a bagpipe procession to the columbarium and the blessing of a Memorial Wreath. All are encouraged to come and pray for our fallen heroes.

In honor of the national holiday, our Parish Office and campus will be closed. Except for the Mass at 11:00 AM, all other events are suspended on Monday. There will be no evening Adoration or Confessions.

Some things happening at the parish that I'd like to highlight this week:

Next Saturday, June 1, from 9:00 AM - 12 Noon, we'll have one of our periodic Formation Days. The theme of this session will be: *The Apparitions of Our Lady Throughout the World*. Come and learn about the many apparitions of Our Lady and their different meanings and messages. All are welcome!

Please join us every Saturday evening at 4:00 PM for Solemn Vespers. All are welcome to come and welcome the Lord's Day in prayer.

Next Sunday, June 2, we'll have our annual Corpus Christi Procession at the end of our 11:00 AM Mass. After the Mass, the Blessed Sacrament will be processed to the

pump house area and Benediction will be given. After the Benediction, we'll have an Ice Cream Social in the parking lot. All are welcome!
