Some other future events I'd like to highlight:

Our next First Friday and First Saturday are August 2-3. Please plan ahead and join your parish family for our monthly Nocturnal Adoration.

Our next Saint Paula Dinner for Widows is Tuesday, August 6, at 5:00 PM. *All widows of the parish are invited!* We'll start with a quiet praying of the Liturgy of the Hours in the Parish Hall. And then after our meal, we'll walk through our parish church and talk about some of the saints depicted in our statues and stained glass.

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) is the process by which a person seeks baptism as a Christian. It also serves to help baptized non-Catholic Christians to receive formation and enter into the fullness of the Catholic Church. Our Deacon Candidate, Binh Davis, is now running this process.
