Some things happening at the parish this week:

As a Papal Missionary of Mercy, I'm periodically called to assist as a confessor and spiritual director for priest retreats. This coming week, July 8-11, I'll be assisting at a retreat in Wheeling, West Virginia. Father Robert Morey will be covering our daily Masses and Confessions while I'm away. *Welcome back, Father Morey!*

The preparation for investiture (or devotional re-investiture) in the Brown Scapular of Our Lady begins this Monday, July 8. If you plan to be invested (or re-invested) in the Brown Scapular on July 16, the feast day of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, then it's recommended you make the nine-day preparation. My recent book, <u>A Journey to Mount Carmel: A Nine-Day Preparation for Investiture in the Brown Scapular of Our Lady</u>, can be a resource and help for the preparation.

This Monday evening, July 8, at 7:00 PM, we have our monthly Stations of the Cross for all those who have left the practice of the Faith. All are welcome to come and walk the Stations for the swift return of all who have fallen away!

Recently, I recorded a miniseries on the Brown Scapular with EWTN. The miniseries will run this Monday – Friday, July 8-12, at 5:30 PM each night. The miniseries can be watched when it initially airs, or any time later on <u>EWTN</u> OnDemand.

Work continues on our parish columbarium! The contractors have concluded the electrical connections and are now working diligently on the pavers.

Our new parish website is still under construction. We'll have the first mock-up presented to leadership this week. Our goal is to have the new website up and running before our programming year starts this Fall.

On Saturday, July 20, we'll have a special summer Formation Day from 9:00 AM – 12 Noon. The theme of the Formation Day is: *Understanding Good Spirits, Bad Spirits, and the Battle at Hand.* All are welcome!

In honor of Saints Joachim and Anne, the parish will offer a special blessing to all grandparents at our weekend Masses on July 20-21.
