From Father Kirby...

Happy Sunday, Team Grace! It's good to be home! The pilgrimage was spiritually renewing and uplifting, but there's no place like home. It's very good to be back!

This weekend, we begin Passiontide, the second and most severe part of Lent. Our statues are covered, the bells are suppressed, and our Mass ends in silence. These additional penances are taken on as a preparation for the Sacred Triduum, when we will walk with the Lord Jesus through his Passion and Death.

This weekend, we'll pause our homily series on evangelization so that I can share some spiritual insights from my pilgrimage to the holy places of Italy.

Here are some things happening at the parish this week:

For Lent, our Stations of the Cross are prayed at 7:00 PM on Mondays. Please come and walk the Stations this Monday, April 7. Please note there are no Stations of the Cross on April 14, since it's Monday of Holy Week. The Solemn Stations at Noon on Good Friday are the Stations for Holy Week.

As a reminder, the Spring module of our Wednesday and other faith formation programs are now on hiatus. Our programs will all resume in September.

During this Lent, we are slowly reintroducing our Thursday Outdoor Masses at the parish columbarium. What a blessing it is for us to now offer these Masses at our new Holy Angels Columbarium! The final outdoor Mass for this Lent will be offered this Thursday, April 10. Please bring a chair or blanket to sit on. When we have our outdoor Masses, we will also have the Thursday holy Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, and our weekly Fellowship outside at the columbarium.

This coming Friday – Saturday, April 11-12, we're very happy to welcome Dr. John Bergsma to the parish. Dr Bergsma will give talks on the Old Testament understanding of the Lord's Passion, Death, and Resurrection. The talks are being given right before we start Holy Week. I encourage everyone to participate and to use these talks as a help to enter into the Paschal Mystery.
