As an aside, a priest's 50th birthday is the milestone when the Church begins to instruct him to prepare for his retirement (which usually isn't until 70 or 75 years old). When a Religious priest retires (i.e., Franciscans, Jesuits, etc.), he goes back to his Order's Motherhouse. When a diocesan priest retires, we're on our own. With only a small pension, we have to find housing and provide for our expenses. This is why the Church advises priests to start the beginnings of their preparation for retirement when they turn 50. And so, in answer to the inquiries of some, if you want to give a gift – and I expect nothing – please consider a monetary gift toward investments and savings for my priest retirement.

On Saturday, May 24, at 8:30 AM, we have our next Prayer Outreach at the local abortion facility. All parishioners are encouraged to come and join in this peaceful, prayerful protest against the horror of abortion. The facility is located at 3220 Latrobe Drive, Charlotte, NC.

Monday, May 26, is Memorial Day. As a nation, we pause and remember those who have died in defense of our freedoms. We'll have a Memorial Day Mass at 11:00 AM. A Procession and Blessing of a Memorial Wreath at the Holy Angels Columbarium will follow the Mass. Confessions will be heard before Mass from 10:00 AM – 10:30 AM.
