Some things happening at the parish this week:

This Monday, May 26, is Memorial Day. As a nation, we pause and remember those who have died in defense of our freedoms. We'll have a Memorial Day Mass at 11:00 AM. A Procession and Blessing of a Memorial Wreath at the Holy Angels Columbarium will follow the Mass. Confessions will be heard before Mass from 10:00 AM - 10:30 AM. All other events are suspended.

This Friday evening, May 30, the parish is honored to host author and television personality, <u>Johnnette Williams</u>. Johnnette is popularly recognized as the host of the EWTN show, <u>Women of Grace</u>. We'll have a Sacred Music Concert at 6:30 PM and then Johnnette will give a talk on *Experience Grace in Abundance* at 7:00 PM. After the talk, we'll have a Fellowship and Book-Signing in the Parish Hall. Free copies of Johnnette's book on grace will be available to all participants.

For the week of June 9 - 13, we're currently working to arrange for some pressing repairs to our parking lot. I'll have more updates by next Sunday.

On Saturday - Sunday, June 14-15, Father David Rivera from the Diocese of Camden, NJ, will be visiting our parish. Father Dave will hear our parish Confessions on Saturday at 3:00 PM and offer our Sunday morning Masses. *Welcome, Father Dave!*

On Monday – Tuesday, June 16-17, Father Robert Morey will be visiting the parish to hear Confessions and offer our daily Mass while I'm away. *Welcome, Father Morey!* Our schedule remains the same on these days except that there will be no *morning Confessions* on Tuesday, June 17.
