This Sunday, June 22, at our 11:00 AM Mass, we will re-commission all of our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMs). These are the faithful men and women who regularly take Holy Communion to the sick and suffering. We thank them for their service!

Also this Sunday, June 22, our 11:00 AM Mass will conclude with a Corpus Christi Procession and Benediction. A Fellowship will follow the Benediction. All parishioners are encouraged to come and celebrate the Lord's Eucharistic Presence among us!

Some things happening at the parish this week:

In honor of Corpus Christi, we will begin to pray the Post-Communion Prayer facing the altar and will give the Final Blessing and Dismissal in Latin. We have been doing these at our daily Masses, and I'd like for them to now become the standard practice at all our parish Masses. These are just some additional practices that will help us to go deeper into the mystery of the Holy Sacrifice.

Please note that with our return to Ordinary Time, we suspend the *Regina Caeli* prayer and now pray the *Angelus* prayer before all our Masses.

Our focus continues to be on our Lourdes Hill (our front hill). The contractors are ready to initiate the work. Hopefully, the rain will stop and let them begin! Once the work starts, it will move quickly! The Bishop is tentatively scheduled to visit our parish on Saturday, August 23. This Thursday, June 26, is the Feast Day of Saint Josemaria Escriva. We are fortunate to have a statue and a relic of the saint in our parish church. As such, the veneration of the saint's relic will be offered at the end of Mass. All are welcome!
