Starting this Monday, August 4, we will now have the Stations of the Cross *every Monday* at 7:00 PM. The Stations have become a popular devotion, and more people would like to walk and pray them together. *All are welcome!*

Our next Saint Paula Dinner is this Tuesday, August 5, at 5:00 PM. All widows of the parish are invited and encouraged to come for fellowship and formation. I've been asked to speak to the group and will be talking about Our Lady as one of the patronesses of widows. Please remember to bring your copy of the Liturgy of the Hours.

As a reminder, we have weekly Prayers to Saint Joseph on Wednesdays around 10:00 AM and a Novena to Saint Dymphna on Wednesdays around 12:45 PM.

Some other events I'd like to highlight:

Next Sunday, August 10, we have our annual School Supply Drive. The school supplies will go to local schools in need. The schools are asking for three specific items:

Please bring these items with you to church and drop them off at the portico before Mass. Members of our Helping Hands ministry will be on-site to help you.

Next Sunday, August 10, we'll have our next Blood Drive. All Christians who are able to give blood are strongly asked to show their love for life and sign up to give blood. Starting next week, our Devotional Prayers at the Holy Angels Columbarium will be on Mondays at 11:00 AM (and not on Tuesdays at 9:30 AM).

Starting Monday, August 11, we'll have the Devotional Prayers for the Poor Souls and the Rosary at the Holy Angels Columbarium at 11:00 AM. All are welcome!

Also, starting on Monday, August 11, our Monday daily Mass will move back to Noon. We attempted the evening Mass, but it never took off. The Mass will now be at Noon, followed by the Poor Souls Novena, Confessions (until the last penitent) and Adoration until 2:15 PM.

On Monday, August 11, we'll have evening Confessions from 6:00 - 7:00 PM. As Confessions begin, we will pray the Miraculous Medal Novena followed by Vespers in the Presence of the Blessed Sacrament, Adoration until 6:55 PM and then the Stations of the Cross at 7:00 PM.

Starting Tuesday, August 12, from 7:00 PM - 8:00 PM, I'll be leading a class on "The Basics and Beginnings of Prayer." The class is for everyone but is particularly geared to those who are just beginning to pray. *All are welcome!*

Please note that we are approaching a Holy Day of Obligation. The Solemnity of Our Lady's Assumption is Friday, August 15. All the baptized are obliged to participate in the Mass for the solemnity. Our Holy Day schedule is: The proper Vigil of the Assumption, Thursday, August 14, at 7:00 PM. The Holy Day proper, Friday, August 15, at 7:30 AM, 9:00 AM, and 11:00 AM. Confessions will follow after each Mass.

Next Sunday, August 17, at 12:30 PM, Deacon Binh Davis will host a Meet-and-Greet for anyone who is interested in learning about the Catholic Church. There is no commitment. The meeting is a casual opportunity to ask any questions about the Catholic Church and to hear about the OCIA process.
