Happy Sunday, Team Grace! It is a blessing when the Bishop visits a parish! It's a reflection of the pastoral visits of the apostles to the various communities in the early Church. We read about such powerful apostolic visits in the Acts of the Apostles, and on August 23, we are able to be a part of such a visit when Bishop Jacques visits our parish!

On Saturday, August 23, the Bishop will offer daily Mass for us at 10:30 AM. *All are invited!* After the Mass, the Bishop will bless our Mary's Grotto, and then we'll have a Parish Festival with food and drinks for everyone. Please mark your calendars and plan on spending this time with our Bishop!

This past week was a Holy Day of Obligation. If you purposely missed the Holy Day, then you need to go to sacramental confession as soon as possible.

I'm happy to announce the creation of the Timothy Group, which is a group of high school upperclassmen from our parish who have visited the seminary and are going deeper in their discipleship and discernment of God's will. The group will assist and serve our 9:00 AM and 11:00 AM Sunday Masses. The Timothy Group complements the Kolbe Group for all high school young men and our altar boy program for middle school and elementary school boys.

Some things happening at the parish this week:

This Sunday, August 17, we offer a blessing to all students as they return to school. May God grant them a formative, fun, and safe academic year!

In the narthex this Sunday, August 17, we have sign-ups for our Wednesday Faith Formation for second to twelfth grade. The program starts on September 3 and runs through a ten-week module in the Fall, and then there's a different ten-week module in the Spring. On Wednesdays, our sessions are from 6:45 PM - 8:00 PM (please note the slight change of schedule from last year). *As a reminder*, at least one parent must be present in the adult Bible Study for a young person to be in any formation program.

no commitment. The meeting is a casual opportunity to ask any questions about the Catholic Church and to hear about the OCIA process.

As a reminder, we now have the Stations of the Cross every Monday at 7:00 PM. The Stations have become a popular devotion, and more people would like to walk and pray them together. *All are welcome!*

Starting this Tuesday, August 19, we'll have Vespers with Adoration and Confessions from 6:00 PM - 7:00 PM. Vespers will be preceded by a Novena to Saint Therese the Little Flower.

Every Tuesday, from 7:00 PM - 8:00 PM, I'm leading a class on "The Basics and Beginnings of Prayer." The class is for everyone but is particularly geared to those who are just beginning to pray. *All are welcome!*

Our next Prayer Outreach is next Saturday, August 23, at 8:30 AM. The Prayer Outreach this month will be shorter (only two Rosaries), so that everyone can make it to the parish in time for daily Mass. *As of now, the Bishop is planning to come to the Prayer Outreach!* The facility is located at 3220 Latrobe Drive, Charlotte, NC. All are invited to come and join in this peaceful, prayerful protest against abortion.
