The work on the handrails at Mary's Grotto is about to start. Once the handrails are secure and inspected, we can open the Grotto for visits. It is my great hope to move this process along and open Mary's Grotto as soon as possible!

Starting this Thursday, September 18, we will start to pray devotional prayers to Saint Josephine Bakhita at 10:00 AM (directly before Morning Prayer-Lauds). We pray for Saint Josephine's intercession to heal the victims of human trafficking and to end this evil practice in our society!

Also starting this Thursday, September 18, our daily Masses on Thursdays will be in honor of the Blessed Sacrament. If there is no assigned saint's day, we will celebrate the Votive Mass of the Most Holy Eucharist. Our Requiem Masses will now move to Mondays (starting September 22). The change is occurring as a part of our overall process to align our devotions to the formal devotions of the Church (i.e., Mondays are for the poor souls in purgatory and Thursdays are in honor of the Blessed Sacrament, etc.).

Some other events I'd like to highlight:

Due to the veneration of Padre Pio's relic, we will not have the Saint Peregrine Novena after Mass on September 23.

On Wednesday, September 24, I'll be in the Diocese of Bridgeport, CT, giving the Bishop's Lecture on the teachings and on-going legacy of the Second Vatican Council. I'm grateful for Bishop Frank Caggiano for this invitation.

While I'm away, Fr. Peter Rusciolelli will offer our daily Noon Mass on Wednesday, September 24. Father Rusciolelli has also agreed to stay after Mass to hear Confessions. On Tuesday, September 30, we'll have two parish Town Hall meetings. The two sessions will be at 1:00 PM and 7:00 PM. During the Town Hall, we'll review the parish's master plan and answer any questions. All parishioners are invited to come and voice their questions, ideas, concerns, and hopes.
