As we near the observance of All Souls Day, November 2, I'd like to clarify some of our Catholic customs:

• The All Souls envelopes are for you to formally ask your local pastor to prayerfully remember your beloved dead through the next year. It is very important that you write the names of your loved ones on the envelopes. The names can be anyone who has died at any time. Please note: the All Souls collection goes directly to the priest. This is the only time in which collected funds go directly to the priest. However, checks should still be made out to the parish. *Please do not make any checks payable to me*. The parish will issue me a check on your behalf.

- The Book of the Dead will be placed by the baptismal font on October 31. Any and all of your beloved dead can be written in the book. It does not matter when your loved ones passed away. Anyone can be written in the book.
- The Reading of Names at our 11:00 AM Mass on All Souls is only for those who have died within the past liturgical year (November 2, 2024 November 1, 2025). Please send your names to Noah Rusciolelli, our Liturgy Coordinator: nrusciolelli@charlestondiocese.org.
