## From Father Kirby...

Happy Sunday, Team Grace! During this season of Ordinary Time, we are invited to go deeper in our relationship with Jesus Christ. Where can we do better? What is the Lord asking of us?

The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary of Our Lady. *All believers are encouraged to pray the Rosary!* As a reminder, the holy Rosary is prayed publicly here at the parish on Mondays at 11:00 AM at the Holy Angels Columbarium and on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays at 11:30 AM in the church.

This Sunday, October 12, the parish will once again sponsor two blood buses. As Christians, giving blood is one of the many ways we cherish and serve life. Please sign up to give blood! Here is the link for sign-ups. Prior sign-ups are required.

Also today, Sunday, October 12, the parish is hosting one of its annual Food Drives. The parish is collecting three specific items: canned corn; canned peas; and Chef Boyardee pasta (not spaghetti or lasagna). Parishioners are asked to bring these items with them to church and drop them off at the pavilion before Mass. Members of our Helping Hands ministry will be on-site to help you.

This Sunday in the narthex, we have sign-ups for our Children's Christmas Choir and Live Nativity. All children of the parish are invited to sign up!

As the years have gone by, our flower donations (Sundays, Christmas, and Easter) have accrued a surplus. The surplus is periodically used to purchase extra flowers for large feast days or special occasions. Even with these events, however, the surplus is still pretty substantial. And so, we're going to use a large portion of the surplus to purchase flowers, foliage, and bushes for Mary's Grotto. This will be a creative way to honor those who make flower donations and use the surplus monies

It reviews local successes, challenges, and plans for the future. The event also allows us to network and meet other community leaders.

This Thursday, October 16, from 10:30 AM – 11:45AM, we will have the first meeting of our monthly Gianna Caregiver Support Group. The group is for spouses who provide direct care or who manage care for their spouse and adult children or other family members who are full time, part-time (or in any way involved) in providing care support to an aging parent(s) or relative. The group is a faith-based, sacred place, for prayer, open conversation and encouragement. It will be facilitated by parishioner Ellen Belk, who founded and runs Keep in Mind, which provides dementia expertise, education, and advising. This year, the Solemnity of All Saints, November 1, is not a Holy Day of Obligation. Since the feast day falls on Saturday, the US Bishops have dispensed the obligation.

For the Solemnity of All Saints, we will have an Anticipated Mass on Friday, October 31, at 5:30 PM. All children of the parish are invited to come to the Mass dressed as saints or other holy people.

On Friday evening, October 31, our Secular Franciscans are hosting their annual "Franciscan Trick or Treat" at 6:30 PM. The group members will be dressed up as Franciscan saints. They will give out candy and talk about various saints. All families are invited to come!

As we near the observance of All Souls Day, November 2, I'd like to clarify some of our Catholic customs:

- The All Souls envelopes are for you to formally ask your local pastor to prayerfully remember your beloved dead through the next year. It is very important that you write the names of your loved ones on the envelopes. The names can be anyone who has died at any time. Please note: the All Souls collection goes directly to the priest. This is the only time in which collected funds go directly to the priest. However, checks should still be made out to the parish. *Please do not make any checks payable to me*. The parish will issue me a check on your behalf.
- The Book of the Dead will be placed by the baptismal font on October 31. Any and all of your beloved dead can be written in the book. It does not matter when your loved ones passed away. Anyone can be written in the book.
- The Reading of Names at our 11:00 AM Mass on All Souls is only for those who have died within the past liturgical year (November 2, 2024 November 1, 2025).
